

## English Language Teaching

### Modules

#### ET1001 English as a Foreign Language A

Credits: 20.0 Semester: 1

Anti-requisite: Native Speaker of English

Description: The module will provide familiarity with a range of grammatical structures and vocabulary. It helps course members to develop the ability to read and process several types of text and to write accurately and appropriately in a variety of styles. They will also improve their listening and speaking skills for both academic and non-academic contexts.

Class Hour: 4.00 pm

Teaching: At least four classes.

Assessment: Continuous Assessment = 20%, 3 Hour Written Examination = 50%, Oral Examination = 30%

Re-Assessment: 3 Hour Written Examination = 50%, Oral Examination = 50%

#### ET1002 English as a Foreign Language B

Credits: 20.0 Semester: 2

Prerequisite: ET1001 or equivalent

Description: This module will complete the study of grammatical structures, and develop a wider range of vocabulary. It helps course members to develop the ability to read and process several types of texts and to write accurately and appropriately in a range of styles. They will also focus on listening and speaking skills required for both academic and non-academic contexts, with an emphasis on a variety of registers.

Class Hour: 4.00 pm

Teaching: At least four classes.

Assessment: Continuous Assessment = 20%, 3 Hour Written Examination = 50%, Oral Examination = 30%

Re-Assessment: 3 Hour Written Examination = 50%, Oral Examination = 50%

#### ET1003 Foundations of Language 1

Credits: 20.0 Semester: 1

Anti-requisites: Cambridge Certificate of Proficiency, Grade B; IELTS 7 or higher.

ET1003 is designed to be taken by **ANY** student, i.e. it is **NOT** specifically for non-native speakers. However the anti-requisite applies to you if English is not your mother tongue and you have studied the language to an advanced level by formal instruction.

Description: This module will provide an understanding of the structure and function of language and will consist of a study of the foundations of English grammar, vocabulary and pronunciation. It will form a useful basis for the study of Modern Languages or Linguistics. There will be an element of active participation in the lectures as well as in the seminars.

Class Hour: 2.00 pm.

Teaching: Three lectures plus one seminar.

Assessment: Continuous Assessment = 40%, 2 Hour Examination = 60%

Re-Assessment: 2 Hour Examination = 100%

## **English Language Teaching - 1000 Level modules**

### **ET1004 Foundations of Language 2**

Credits: 20.0 Semester: 2

Like ET1003, this course is designed to be taken by any student, whether a native or non-native speaker of English and, in this case, advanced non-native speakers are entitled to participate.

Description: This module will provide an understanding of language and society, language and the mind, and teaching language. Like ET1003, it will form a useful basis for the study of Modern Languages or Linguistics. There will be an element of active participation in the lectures as well as in the seminars.

Class Hour: 2.00 pm.

Teaching: Three lectures plus one seminar.

Assessment: Continuous Assessment = 40%, 2 Hour Examination = 60%

Re-Assessment: 2 Hour Examination = 100%
