

BA (International Honours) The College of William & Mary

The general requirements are 480 SCOTCAT credits over a period of 4 years. 120 credits (equivalent to 30 William & Mary credit hours) are to be accumulated each year. One sub-honours year and one Honours year must be spent at each institution. To qualify for entry into Year 3 of the programme, a total of 240 SCOTCAT credits must be gained.

Students may not take modules which cover content already studied at the other institution. Please consult your Honours Adviser for further guidance.
