Automatic Entry to Honours

Students who pass and attain an average of grade 11.0 or above at the first sitting in the requisite 2000-level modules and who meet all other programme requirements will be given automatic offers of entry into Honours programmes.

Students permitted automatic entry to Honours will only be permitted to trail one module to a maximum of 30 sub-honours credits into Honours.

BSc / MA Honours

The general requirements are 480 credits over a period of normally four years (and not more than five years) or part-time equivalent, of which the final two years form an approved Honours programme of 240 credits, of which 90 credits are at 4000 or 5000 level and at least a further 120 credits at 3000 and/or 4000 or 5000 levels.

BSc / MA Honours with Integrated Year Abroad

The general requirements are 540 credits over a period of normally five years (and not more than six years) or part-time equivalent, of which the final three years are an approved Honours programme of 300 credits, of which 60 credits are gained during the integrated year abroad, 90 credits are at 4000 or 5000 level and at least a further 120 credits at 3000 and/or 4000 or 5000 levels.

Study Abroad: In the case of students who spend part of the Honours programme on a recognised Study Abroad scheme, the Programme Requirements will be amended to take into account overseas courses which are approved by the (see <http://www.st-andrews.ac.uk/studyabroad/outgoingstudents/AcademicInformation/>).

Fourth Year: 120 credits: EC3302 - EC3350, EC4401 - EC4499, EC5201 - EC5203 selected MN and IR modules approved by the Director of Teaching in the School of Economics & Finance AND the other School.

Access to EC5201 - EC5203 is only available with the permission of the Director of Teaching to students in the Second Year of an Honours Programme who have achieved at least 17.5 in a relevant module, namely in EC3303 or EC3306 for EC5201, in EC3302 or EC3305 for EC5202, in EC4401 for EC5203.

Students must take at least 40 credits from EC3302 - EC3350, EC4401 over third and fourth year. Students may take a maximum of 30 credits in MN and IR modules.

In total, 240 credits must be achieved at 3000, 4000 and 5000 level including at least 90 credits at 4000 or 5000 level.

Students must take at least 40 credits from EC3302 – EC3350, EC4401 over third and fourth year.
